***All extra curricular activities are open to all girls and new comers are very welcome.***



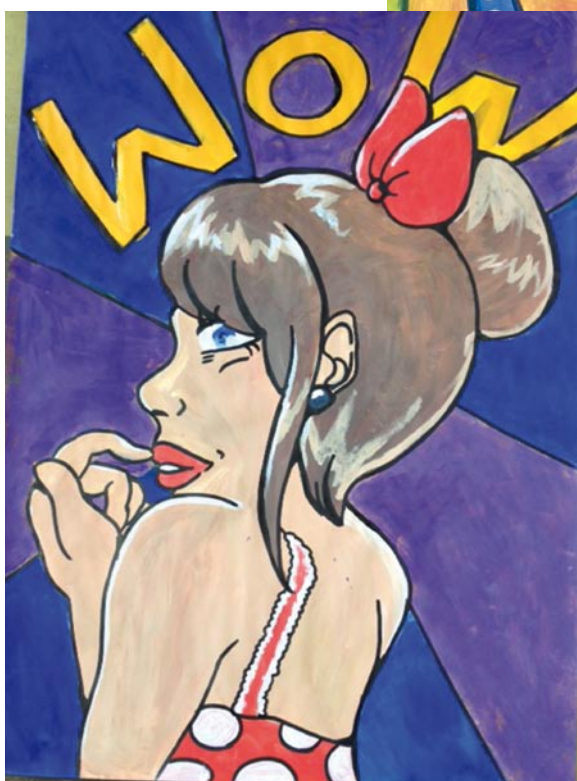
